The pitcher of the year standings are on the website. Go to Awards on the top of the home page, then click on Current Standings to see the full standings for each division. It will be updated as the tournament results come in. The current leaders are Division A - John Meyer, Tammy Newkirk and Eugene Pribnow. Division B – Dave Quaid, Jeff Gustafson, Dick Perkins and Rayna Bauer. Class C – Dan Newkirk, Kalena Quaid and Russ Brockway. The contest runs through the end of July. Pitchers receive points for how they finish in open WHPA sanctioned tournaments (Ist -I5 pts, 2nd -I0 pts, 3rd-5 pts) and I5 points for attending the WHPA Spring and Fall meetings.

## 2022 WHPA Spring Meeting April 16, 2022 – Lake Delton Sportsmen Club Kevin Brekke

Call to order by President Dobie at 1:00 pm. Dobie led us into the Pledge of Allegiance and a moment of silence for those not with us, and for those facing difficulties we may not know about.

Secretary John Secord read the minutes of the fall meeting and they were accepted as read. That meeting had 48 in attendance. John also gave the treasurers report. The beginning balance was 5,307.52 and ending balance was 6,770.50. Treasurers report was accepted as read.

Dave Volz gave the I<sup>st</sup> VP report. He mentioned the Pitcher of the Year stats are on the website and updated and runs through July 31. You get 15 points for just attending the spring and fall state meetings. Dave said we have 274 active pitchers that have pitched in one or more tournaments. Of those 274, 52 have only been members the last two years. Dave also mentioned that he put together a 'Join the WHPA' booklet to promote the WHPA this year. Copies were available to those in attendance and had our current state champs pictures on the back with a plug for our 100<sup>th</sup> State Tournament in Beloit coming up. The booklet also mentions what the WHPA is, its benefits, the website and facebook locations, and a little bit about ESHOE. Nice job Dave. Dave mentioned Eshoe, and how you can use it to add or renew a membership. There is also a form there for new members to qualify pitching their 100 shoes before their first sanctioned tournament. For a listing of all the Wisconsin pitchers, ESHOE can provide this by just typing in Wisconsin to get the list. On the WHPA website, the year stats are now available as far back as 1987. There is also a state tournament page with the winners back to 2007. The missing newsletters are now scanned in, and now all the newsletters are available.

Dave's Regional Directors report. Dave had a hardcopy of the State schedule that is on the WHPA website, and said sometimes things change throughout the year, so when you print it out, look at the upper left had corner. The upcoming World Tournaments.

World 2022 – Monroe, LA July 11-23, 2022 World 2023 – Lansing, MI July 17-31, 2023

On the national website you can get how many have signed up for this year's world, and of last week the number was 162, which Dave said was typical, as most sign up closer to the deadline. Dave said only four from Wisconsin had signed up, and he was one of many that still need to send in their entry. Dave had some visitor



bureau info for World on the table for those that wanted one. On the website you can order World Tournament merchandise and Dave displayed a t-shirt he ordered. You can still get merchandise at World, but when you pre-ordered, you can get your name and state on your shirt, and have it before you go down if you want.

Dan Newkirk gave the 2<sup>nd</sup> VP report. He had an example of the attendance bag every pitcher will get for this year's 100<sup>th</sup> State Tournament. He said Fred Lane will be doing trading cards for the 100<sup>th</sup>. Fred went to Beloit and spent almost 8 hours taking pictures of all the past hall of fame inductees and will be working with Jeff Secord, hall of fame chairmen to get the write-ups on the back of the card. There will be horseshoe displays, and camping will be limited, so if you want to camp, let Dan know sooner than later. Dan mentioned the setup for Telfer Park will be next Saturday the 23<sup>rd</sup>, and the Beloit club will need help with getting the clay to the boxes that day. Lunch will be provided by the club. There will be a group email sent beforehand.

Sonia Cook gave the 3<sup>rd</sup> VP report. Current liabilities are 4,800 and balance of 11,396. Sonia will be doing the raffle again this year, and only printed 1500 tickets, so when they are gone, they are gone. She asked for donations for the prizes, so there will be cash prizes along with many other prizes, which is to be determined. Last year there were 41 donated prizes. Sonia also announced a \$300 disbursement to Gabe Burgin for postsecondary education.

Jane Smith our Newsletter Editor wanted people to submit more pictures to her as they really add to the stories and articles. She thanked the people that help her throughout the year especially Dave and Gary Volz. She mentioned they still print and mail about 20 to 25 copies each time.

WHPA Spring Minutes continued from page 6 leff Secord our Hall of Fame chairmen announced that the 2022 Inductee to the Wisconsin Hall of Fame this year is more than one inductee, because of the possibility of ties with eight members on the committee. This years' inductees are: Penny Steinke, Aleena Lepak, Sonia Cook, and Glenn Bogenschneider. Because of the numbers being inducted, and one falling off after 10 years, Jeff mentioned that they need more nominations to come in this year. To be nominated, that person needs to have been a NHPA member for at least 10 years, and made a valuable contribution to the WHPA through promotion, pitching, etc. Bruce McLinn mentioned that at the Beloit Club there is a horseshoe display for World Tournament winners, and that display is not current. Dan Newkirk said he knew it was not current and will follow-up.

Old Business - Jane Smith asked if we were still doing the Each One, Reach One contest again, and the answer was Yes.

New Business - Dobie brought up that the Beloit Club had a rent increase for renting Telfer Park building this year which was significant. She provided a pouch people could put their donations in. Dobie also mentioned that the state officers up for re-election in the fall are John Secord, Secretary Treasurer, Dave Volz, I<sup>st</sup> VP, and Sonia Cook, 3<sup>rd</sup> VP. Anyone who wants to run for any one of those offices needs to announce their intentions by July 31 and have them published in our state newsletter.

Jeff Secord wanted to promote Team Tournaments and mentioned three. The State Club Team is April 30<sup>th</sup>, and Dave Volz, tournament director still has openings. He can take 24 teams, and currently only had 17. Team World is May 13,14,15. Jeff happily announced we have 24 teams this year, first time in 19 years we are full. There is one new team from the state of Washington. The third team tournament Jeff mentioned was his Fond du Lac Team Tournament on August 14. It was held last year with the minimum number of teams at four. He would like to see that increase and can take up to ten teams. This is a three-person team tournament with an average not to exceed 133 percent. It was asked if this could be moved to another weekend, but since the Fond du Lac open is Saturday, it makes sense to have it

on Sunday at those courts. Deadline for this tournament is August I. The format will be similar to Club Team.

Ralph Marthaler asked about World 2024 and if Wisconsin is considering making a bid in the future. Dave Volz responded that he did not hear anything yet on 2024 or if anyone was considering a bid from Wisconsin.

Fred Lane, publicity director, mentioned the Stevens Point Open will be May 21,22 because of the World Tournament dates in July this year. Fred mentioned to everyone to promote this year because it is our 100<sup>th</sup> State Tournament. Fred let everyone know he is willing to help anyone to promote horseshoes anytime. Fred mentioned about the trading cards that our specific to our Hall of Fame members, and to look for them at this year's state tournament. He also mentioned that some sets will have a 'special card' insert. It was mentioned to maybe come up with a flyer to promote the 100<sup>th</sup>. Fred said that was a great idea, and to mention our website that has so much information. Put it on your tournament flyer and a link to the website.

We had two new people at our meeting from out of state, Carey Jennings and her dad. She is from Idaho and moved back to Holmen Wisconsin. I spoke with Carey after the meeting and got her information and gave her Rich Brockway's number. I talked with Rich Brockway and said she would be calling her as they live in the same town. She was an active member in Idaho and I am sure you will be seeing her on the courts.






